NEW! CSPE VIDEOS

We've now added a videos page to our website, offering a range of CSPE related videos that will be added to from time to time. These range from useful discussion starters to substantial educational tools (see above for screenshot). Topics include human rights, democracy etc. The collection features animations, interviews, profiles etc. The videos can be shown in class for those with broadband connection, but as some are from YouTube which is blocked on the educational network they will have to be downloaded at home first – e.g. using free software like *Realplayer SP*, *YouTube Downloader* or equivalent. Some of the videos are from a series on the Universal Declaration of Human Rights – each right is treated in a one-minute video clip. Note that these videos, while very useful and professional but have an American flavour and are made by Youth for Human Rights, which has links to Scientology.
